- ❑ 2 no copies of 1:500 site layout plan indicating position of scaffolding/hoarding relative to premises adjoining development
- ❑ licence fee – €1250 per annum or €125 per month or any part of month
- ❑ Evidence of Public liability insurance in the sum of €6.5million
- ❑ Evidence of planning permission or exemption from planning
- ❑ Contractor details and appointed Health & safety representative for your site
- ❑ Extract from Contractors Health & Safety plan regarding scaffolding/hoarding
- ❑ Traffic and pedestrian management plan including sketch of site
