But then everything changed when my two brothers Paddy and Jack died by suicide.

My name is Helen Hutchinson, also known as Nellie. I am a Traveller woman also a poet. I was brought up in a small village in Cloughjordan but now live in Nenagh.

I use my poetry to voice my pride as a Traveller and in this way I hope to educate members of the settled community about travellers.

*Standing at the old house now
This house where I grew up
My mind is full of memories
Tears run down my face in floods
Remembering the happy times
When we were all of us young
All the drinking parties
And all the songs we sang.
We've all gone in different directions now
It's so hard to believe
We lived a life and had some fun
Until the BAD times began
I'm so lonely and heartbroken now
As I stand here on my own
Looking back at history now
I know where things went wrong
A Traveller family in a house
This never should have been
Taken away from our own clan
And left to live a life on our own
This old house is still standing
It almost welcomes me in
I turn away with my memories
I don't think I'll be back again*

Festival Launch with Michael Fortune

Roscrea Library • Friday 5 May 1pm



Join us for the Tipperary Bealtaine Launch at 1pm on Friday 5th of May when artist/folklorist Michael Fortune and participants from Age Friendly Roscrea showcase their work and findings from their recent folklore and reminiscence project.

Back in late 2022 artist/folklorist Michael Fortune began work on a project with staff and participants from Age Friendly Roscrea recording stories, tales and memories in the centre and also in people's homes. For the Tipperary Bealtaine Programme, Michael and the group have produced this material into a pop-up exhibition featuring images, text and films.

These exhibition boards will also contain QR codes so you can scan your phone and be brought directly to YouTube to hear interviews and chats come alive. The boards will be on display in Roscrea Library for the month of May.

Michael Fortune has been a pioneer in the area of socially engaged work within Ireland over the past twenty years and his practice has widened the conversations regarding the intersection of traditional and contemporary cultures. Michael grew up in a family immersed in story, superstition and folk belief in an area known as 'The Macamores', an old Gaelic stronghold stretching along the east coast of Wexford. He completed his BA in Fine Art, specialising in video and performance, at Limerick School of Art in 1999 and his MA in Screenwriting at DLIADT in 2003.

Fortune continues to produce project work throughout the country and works as a part-time Associate Lecturer at Limerick School of Art and Design (Master of Education and Digital Media). He also conducts work as a Visiting Lecturer in many colleges and in universities Ireland.

Darn It - Mending Matters

Mon 8 - Thur 18 May

Darn It - Mending Matters is a creative, empowering programme of sustainability and renewal through the arts.

Initiated by the Tudor Artisan Hub, this programme is inspired by 'Kintsugi', the Japanese art of putting broken pottery pieces back together with gold - built on the idea that in embracing flaws and imperfections, you can create an even stronger, more beautiful piece to cherish.

Participants are invited to engage, through a series of workshops and demonstrations, in learning simple practical skills to repair, reuse, repurpose and renew belongings. Environmental sustainability and reconnecting people with vanishing life skills is at the core of this mending project. We have an opportunity to raise awareness and work together to be more intentional and creative about what we consume, keep, and discard.

The Slieveardagh Recollection Collection is a project created by older members of the community who use the services of The Millennium Family Resource Centre, the staff of the centre and artist Katy Goodhue.



For this project, participants celebrate their collective and individual pasts, highlighting that everyone has a story, a memory, an object, a thought, a recollection to share. Katy has photographed and recorded individuals and groups as they talk about items they still have and speak of their memories of past days.

Katy Goodhue is a visual artist who lives and works in the Slieveardagh Hills. Alongside her sculpture she works with senior members of the locality to gather and share stories of the heritage of local coal mines and life in the past, this project will continue this collection.

Chelsea Canavan and Andy Spearpoint are working with residents at Newport Day Centre. Residents are sharing of stories associated with items of personal significance to co-create artworks and soundscapes.

Using a variety of media the group members are exploring technology through the making of short animations and time-lapse pieces. The sound work involves the collection of various sound elements, some group playing and singing and the creation of recorded sound pieces to accompany the artworks.

Sight, Sound, Story will be sharing the work with participants' friends and families in a community gathering during the month of May.

Andy Spearpoint is a community musician who works with groups of all ages in education and community settings. He has been developing work for older adults involving the creation of interactive sound worlds using the voice of participants along with various home made and electronic instruments.

Chelsea Canavan is a socially engaged, multi-disciplinary visual artist who uses a broad range of media including drawing, collage, construction, sound, video and animation.

For Bealtaine 2023, local artist Aoife Barrett (Print Van Go, travelling print studio) is working with Clonoulty's 'Young At Heart' club and other members of the community on a creative project to explore the joys of herbal health and the many and varied uses and needs for herbs.



Aoife will facilitate a pop-up tea room at the Clonoulty Community Hall and run a series of creative sessions and gatherings to restore, reconnect and reimagine our herbal traditions. Aoife invites members of Young At Heart and the wider Clonoulty community to join her at the Clonoulty Community Hall to make and share together over a cup of herbal tea while engaging in activities and discussions around our herbal traditions. Creative workshops will involve planting and growing herbs, sharing herbal remedies, recipes, printmaking and textiles. No experience necessary.

Aoife Barrett graduated with an M.A. in Multi-Disciplinary Printmaking from the University of the West England in 2015 before going on to set up 'Print Van Go', traveling print studio. She has exhibited in a number of solo and group shows throughout Ireland and internationally. Aoife also enjoys working in community and health care settings, as well as with artists and arts organisations to deliver large-scale public print events and projects.

Prompted by a reprinting of the original Nature Trail pamphlet of Glengarra Wood (courtesy of Galtee Honey Farm), a series of recorded interviews with senior citizens from the Galtee Vee Valley in April 2023 will be featured, alongside woodland drone footage and interviews of retired foresters and former hikers, as part of a short documentary film. Participants, on revisiting Glengarra Wood and Mountain Lodge on a Nature Trail By Bus will retrace their steps before a screening of this documentary. Serving as the inspiration for our tea-time storytelling session at Glengarra Mountain Lodge, the afternoon will close with a leaf printing workshop and real-time creation of a new Nature Trail pamphlet for Glengarra Wood with artist Deirdre Dunne.

Joey Maguire is a multi-disciplinary artist, educator and live event technician. He performs as both a solo artist and as a member of Timpeall. Joey's artistic work encourages the audience to connect with their inner-child, create a sense of immersion and engage the participant in a state of play with the piece. Aisling Fitzgerald is a Musician, Creative Producer and Lecturer and works predominately in Opera and Festival production.

Her creative practice is channelled through the development of an arts and cultural programme at Glengarra Mountain Lodge where Aisling's community-based and inter-generational artistic programming is inspired by heritage, both natural and architectural.



DAVID DONOGHUE is a former Irish diplomat who served in various senior roles in Ireland and abroad. He worked for many years on the Northern Ireland peace process and was a member of the Irish Government's team in the negotiations which led to the Good Friday Agreement (1998),

He recently published a book on those negotiations ("One Good Day", Gill Books 2022). later serving in many high-profile rolls around the world, he retired from the Irish public service in 2017, but remains active in various think-tanks on issues around conflict resolution sustainable development and the treatment of migrants and refugees.

One Good Day is the fascinating insider account of the Good Friday negotiations from diplomat David Donoghue, who was then Irish head of the Anglo-Irish Secretariat in Belfast. It explores the complex, delicate and often frustrating series of talks that drew the troubles to an end.

April 2023 marks the 25-year anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement, Hailed internationally as a near -miracle of collective collaboration, compromiser and diplomacy.
