1.	<p><u>To Note Adherence to Meeting Procedure Requirements</u></p> <p>1.1 Quorum</p> <p>Margo Hayes confirmed that a quorum had been achieved to proceed with the meeting.</p> <p>1.2 Conflict of Interest</p> <p>Margo Hayes confirmed that the LCDC had been notified of the requirements to indicate COI and any issues arising would be discussed prior to formal discussion of the projects. It was noted that MI Murray had declared a conflict of interest (Col) in relation to project number 30LDRNTP108974 – Moneygall GAA Club.</p> <p>1.3 Decision-Making Requirements to include LEADER written decision</p> <p>No comment necessary.</p>
2.	<p><u>Approval of Draft Agenda</u></p> <p>Cllr. John Carroll, Chair declared the meeting open. Apologies were noted. Draft Agenda was approved.</p>
3.	<p><u>Confirmation of Minutes</u></p> <p>Cllr. John Carroll took this opportunity to convey best wishes to both Attracta Lyons and Fiona Hughes who are leaving Tipperary County Council to take up new posts elsewhere and to thank them for their tremendous work and support to the LCDC over the last few years.</p> <p>The minutes of Tipperary LCDC meeting held on 21st January, 2019 were agreed on the proposal of Cllr. Mary Hanna Hourigan and seconded by Eoin Wolahan. The issue of recruitment of an Environmental Awareness Officer by Tipperary County Council was raised. Teresa Kiely advised the meeting that she had issued a letter to Sean Keating, Director of Environment & Climate Change following the January meeting. The Members were advised that staffing arrangements in Tipperary County Council or any other agency are not within the remit of the LCDC. The Members stated that this was not about the recruitment of any particular role but that it was an issue of relevance/interest to it in its co-ordination role. A wider discussion took place on environmental control, littering and climate change matters and it was agreed to invite Mr. Keating to attend the March meeting to present on the Climate Action Adaptation Strategy Process.</p>

7.	<p><u>Healthy Ireland</u></p> <p>On the agreement of the members, this item was taken at this stage of the meeting. Maria Bridgeman presented a proposal for Tipperary LCDC to reconstitute the Healthy Tipperary sub group. M. Bridgeman distributed the draft terms of reference setting out the purpose of the sub group and the proposed membership. It is necessary that the agreed actions in the Healthy Tipperary Plan be rolled out in line with the funding calls. It was suggested that the following partners also be invited to sit on this sub group: Local Development Companies, Tipperary ETB, Age Friendly Co-ordinator, PPN reps (disability, environmental rep). Further comments can be issued by email to Maria - maria.bridgeman@hse.ie The draft proposal was agreed on the proposal of Martin Quinn and seconded by Cllr. Mary Hanna Hourigan subject to additional membership been sought as outlined above. A final copy of the proposal will be issued to the members.</p>
4.	<p>National Community Weekend 4th - 6th May 2019</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To approve the guidelines in the application process for funding of events <p>Teresa Kiely referred to the recent announcement on the National Community Event (4th-6th May, 2019) and to the guidelines which were circulated with the agenda. €10,000 has been allocated by the DRCD to Tipperary LCDC to distribute towards the holding of community events that weekend. The purpose of this event is to celebrate the great spirit of community that exists across Ireland and to help people to come together, get to know each other and deepen the sense of community in their area. It is intended that small grants of €100 - €300 per event be available from the LCDC.</p> <p>It was agreed by the Members that funding would be issued to successful promoters in advance of their event. Members requested that the deadline for receipt of applications be put back by 2 weeks to 21st March. Following discussion, and on the proposal of John Lupton and seconded by Eileen Condon, it was agreed to proceed with this event and the guidelines were approved subject to the revision to the closing date.</p>
5.	<p>SICAP Update</p> <p>Margo Hayes informed the Members that the Social Inclusion sub-group met with both Implementing Partners and carried out the 2018 end of year appraisal which reviewed both targets and cost charge reports. The end of year review was approved accordingly. M Hayes confirmed that there was a minimal underspend by STDC and an underspend of approx €12,500 by NTDC and that this underspend will be absorbed. However, it was noted that this review provided both Implementing Partners an opportunity to provide an update on feedback on the work undertaken in 2018. This end of year Appraisal process must be finalized by 28th February. Clare Cashman, Chair, Social Inclusion Sub Group complimented both Implementing Partners on meeting their targets for 2018. It was noted that the SICAP Programme Managers will present their 2019 Annual Plans together with shared experience through some case studies at the March meeting. Cllr. John Carroll thanked both M. Hayes and C. Cashman for the SICAP update.</p>

6.3 To approve proposal for the reallocation of Measure - Budgets

Cllr. John Carroll confirmed that the reallocation of Measure Budgets Report was circulated to the Members at the January meeting for consideration and that it was agreed that a decision would be taken on this matter today. It was noted that Circular 14-2018 provides the LCDC with more flexibility to re-allocate funds within overall budget and a discretionary element which does not require prior sanction from the Department.

The proposal circulated seeks to move 33% of budget from Water and Biodiversity sub-themes and 25% from Energy sub-theme to Enterprise (20%) & Rural Towns (40%) both of which are Economic sub-themes and Basic Services (40%) which is a sub-theme within Social Inclusion. Discretion is ongoing according to M Moroney who confirmed that funds can be diverted back to original sources.

Following discussion and on the proposal of Clare Cashman and seconded by John Lupton the proposal and re-allocation report was agreed.

6.2 Tipperary Annual Progress Report (2018) & Implementation Plan (2019)

Teresa Kiely referred to the draft Tipperary LEADER Annual Progress Report and Implementation Plan for 2019 which was issued to the Members by email earlier in the week. T. Kiely thanked both Implementing Partners for their inputs into this draft report. It was agreed by the Members that following the reallocation of measure budgets (item no. 6.3), that the report be now amended to include the revised budget figures. On the proposal of John Lupton and seconded by Cllr. Mary Hanna Hourigan this was approved. A copy of the final report will be issued to the LCDC Members for their information.

6.4 To approve Monthly Income & Expenditure Report

Michael Moroney outlined the LDS Administration & Animation financial expenditure and income report to January 2019 inclusive which was circulated at the meeting. This report now includes the monthly Financial Partner (TCC) staffing costs. On the proposal of Eoin Wolahan and seconded by Martin Quinn, the report was approved by the members.
