In relation to projects 30LDNTP111353 [Life Connections, Training] and 30LDRNTP111358 [Life Connections, Equipment] John Lupton pointed out that this was a very important area dealing with children but this project would very much be dependent upon the goodwill of parents and schools. He asked if there were quality standards to be adhered to. Michael Murray said that they had charitable status and that the programme will be carried out in schools with the consent of parents. He said it would be a bespoke programme relevant to the needs of the population. Bernadette Cullen said that there was a preference for this type of programme to be administered by someone that children knew and were familiar with. She added that risks were attached to have an outside entity involved. She expressed concerns that his could create further issues. Seán O'Farrell asked what the qualifications of those involved were. Michael Murray said that there are three directors each with a background in the area. He said one had a masters in family support and had been involved in the Ascend project. He continued that another had been chairperson of the Silverarch Family Resource Centre in Nenagh. Bernadette Cullen said that there is a Department Circular relating to outside speakers and children and that this framework ought to be taken into account.

In relation to project 30LDRNTP111358 [Life Connections - Equipment] Michael Murray said that the approval by the North Tipperary IEC at their meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> January last had included an error in calculation on the quotation analysis/assessment/minutes regarding the above project. The total cost of the project was  $\in 8,503.22$  – there is a reduction in that figure of  $\notin 9.84$  and the total project costs are now  $\notin 8,493.38$ . The revised grant amount is now  $\notin 4,246.69$ .

projects were evaluated there. He said the projects were being funded on a 5 (KLP) 3 (LP) 1 (Tipperary) ratio. The Tipperary portion was being split further between NTDC and STDC. He said that the project would include litter picks, oral history projects, invasive species management and upland management. He added that a company Florú had been awarded the tender and will contract in the expertise.

Charles Stanley Smith asked if LAWPRO were involved and Michael Murray confirmed that they are. Charles Stanley Smith that it seemed like a lot of money for litter picks. He added that these were often organized for free by voluntary groups. He pointed out that there is no government body responsible for the management of invasive species. He continued saying the mismanagement of uplands would make things worse than doing nothing at all. He said that Kilkenny County Council, who is the lead partner on these projects, had damaged the bed of the river Nore as a result if works carried out building a bridge. Michael Murray said that representatives from Tipperary County Council or indeed the LCDC were welcome to join the steering group. He said the intention was to bring all the stakeholders together. Mary Barry Guerin of STDC said that they were confident of the level of expertise on board. Donal Mullane said that it seemed a large amount of money for one company to receive for training. Seán O'Farrell asked if Irish Water, the Irish Farmers Association and tourism representatives were involved. Mary Barry Guerin said the objective is that they will be. Seán O'Farrell said that Irish Water is responsible for waste water treatment and their input would be important. Michael Murray said clarity would have to be sought on Irish Water's participation. Donal Mullane asked about the timeframe for the project. Michael Murray said that it was 18 months. He added that the LCDC could seek an implementation plan if required.

Cllr John Carroll (Chair) said that water projects are complex and have proved difficult to animate. Charles Stanley Smith asked for further information on Florú. Michael Murray said that they a training company with an IT expertise. Mary Barry Guerin added that there had been a competitive tendering process. Imelda Walsh said there were a lot concerns about these projects and questioned whether it was wise to proceed. Pat Slattery (Chief Officer) these were cross county projects and was conscience of slowing up the process. He added that water project had proven difficult to animate. He suggested that the LCDC could approve and seek clarifications if necessary. Alternatively a smaller sub-group of the LCDC could meet. Mary Barry Guerin said that these projects had been a couple of years in development. Michael Murray acknowledged that there were gueries but said there was a time pressure associated with the projects. He added that Laois Partnership was meeting today to consider the project. Seán O'Farrell said that concerns remained. Martin Quinn didn't want to unduly delay the project. Mary Barry Guerin said that there are concerns from Kilkenny LEADER Partnership that the timeline to carry out the project was becoming tight. Pat Slattery (Chief Officer) suggested that Fran Igoe (LAWPRO) could come into the LCDC or subgroup to help alleviate concerns. Cllr John Carroll (Chair) asked the members if the viewed the issues arising as negating factors. Michael Murray said that the consultants in these projects would need to be managed. He offered to ring Declan Rice CEO of Kilkenny LEADER Partnership to seek clarifications. Michael Murray returned to the meeting having spoken to Declan Rice. He informed the members that there was a comprehensive vision document with more detail. He said the organization on board were Tipperary County Council, NGOs, Sports organizations, the IFA and the OPW. He said Irish Water had been invited but had not attended. He added that a matrix of training outputs was included as part of the tender process. He said that one similar project was being looked at in Inisowen. In relation to project 30LDRSTP106974 [Patrick Fitzgerald, New Inn] Adrian Cunneen absented himself from the meeting for the duration of their consideration in order to maintain the correct public/private balance.

Seán O'Farrell said while this project (30LDRSTP106974 Patrick Fitzgerald, New Inn) represented an example of farm diversification he would prefer a move more towards sustainability in communities. Donal Mullane said it was good to see good farm projects coming before the committee. Seán O'Farrell said we should be moving towards zero waste and what was needed was a community approach and regenerative farming.

Donal Mullane said that he was concerned with roadside signs he had seen promoting veganism. He said he was worried about disinformation being targeted at young people in this regard. Charles Stanley Smith strongly disagreed. Imelda Walsh said that farmers were being used as scapegoats.

## 6.2 Consideration of proposals and recommendation in relation to additional C500,000 funding

Shane O'Dwyer informed the meeting that this item was being deferred. He said that a meeting of Tipperary County Council LCDC staff and the implementing partners would take place. Following on from this they would revert to the LCDC with one or more proposals regarding the additional LEADER funding. Seán O'Farrell said that he would like to see additional funding being targeted toward less well off parts of the community. Michael Murray said that there are some projects already being queued up. Shane O'Dwyer said that it would be for the LCDC to decide whether there will be geographic or thematic considerations for the additional funding.

Seán O'Farrell said that bodies such as the Tipperary Energy Agency and Tipperary Local Enterprise Office should work with communities in towns like Roscrea, Tipperary and Carrick-on-Suir to access climate action funding. He referenced Cloughjordan eco village as good model of a sustainable community. Cllr John Carroll (Chair) that we need to be aware of existing strategies and national policies that are outside the committee's remit. Anthony FitzGerald said that the climate action fund was part of Project Ireland 2040. He said much was being done in this area and that the Tipperary Energy Agency was very active. He added that it would be important not to dilute what is already being undertaken. Seán O'Farrell said that we should invite SEAI and the TEA to come and present to LCDC.
