Tribute to the late Cllr. Eddie O'Meara. The Cathaoirleach led the members present in paying tribute to Cllr. Eddie O'Meara, who died unexpectedly on the 12th of April, 2018. The members praised his astuteness, wisdom and dedication to his native Mullinahone. The District Administrator joined in the tributes on behalf of the County Council's staff.

Minutes of Meetings The minutes of the meeting of the 22nd of March, 2018 were adopted on the proposal of Cllr. Louise McLoughlin seconded by Cllr. David Dunne, and were signed by the Cathaoirleach.

The record of the Security Committee Meeting with the Thurles Garda District was noted.

Update from the Community and Economic Development Directorate. Ms Margo Hayes circulated a report to the members in relation to the activities of the Community and economic Development Directorate in the District since the start of the year.

- How many of the 1,347 members of the County Tipperary Public Participation Network were active?

Cllr. David Dunne

- Asked about Broadband

Cllr. Kieran Bourke

- Raised the issue of Mobile Phone coverage in the county.

Ms Hayes responded as follows:

- Approximately one hundred groups attend the plenary sessions of the Public Participation Network. Approximately forty six of these have been appointed to committees.
- The Directorate has engaged with a group in Carrick-on-Suir with a view to providing a Community Broadband Hub.
- Mobile Phone coverage black spots in the County have been identified.

- Renewal of paving on N24 in Carrick-on-Suir

- Purpose of Public Lighting Allocation in the Schedule of Municipal District Works.

Cllr. Imelda Goldsboro

- What percentage of roads in the District are below standard

The District Engineer gave the following responses:

- Budget for Public Lighting was for dealing with lights damaged

through wear and tear, road traffic accidents, and so on.

- Replacement of road markings would concentrate on those locations most in need of attention
- There was a weed spraying programme which would be followed
- A list of the different categories of road, with the condition of each category, would be circulated to the members.
- A list of the roads submitted for emergency funding will be forwarded to the members.
- Planning for the renewal of the pavement of the N24 in Carrick-on-Suir was taking place, and it was expected the work would be carried out in 2019. In the meantime, work in O'Mahoney Avenue would be investigated.

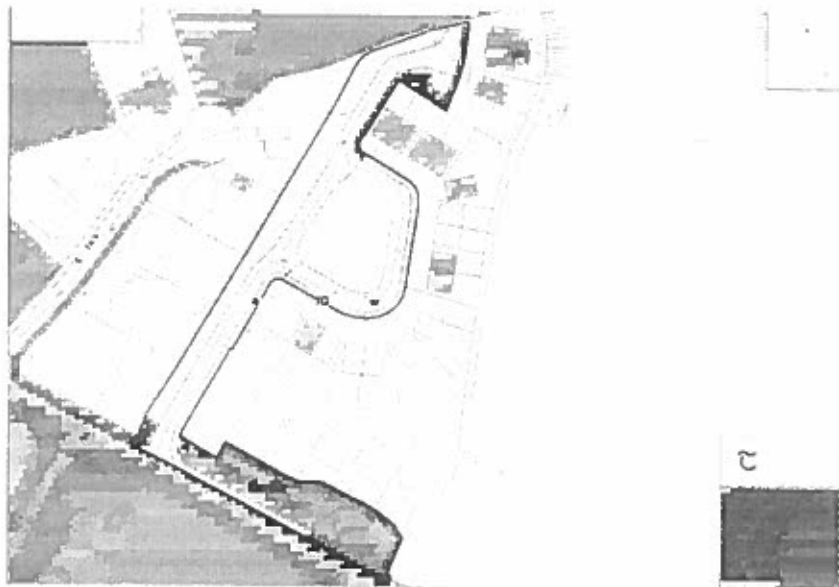
A report from the Director of Services for Roads and Transportation in relation to the taking in charge of the housing estates at Manor Close, Manor View and Gate, Carrickbeg, Carrick-on-Suir had been circulated in advance of the meeting.

It was proposed by Cllr. David Dunne , seconded by Cllr. Kieran Bourke and resolved:

“That pursuant to the provisions of section 180 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and section 11 of the Roads Act 1993 the being satisfied that the roads are of public utility, and having considered the financial implications for the local authority, it is hereby ordered that the roads serving the housing estate known as

- Manor Close
- Manor Gate
- Manor View

Be declared to be public roads. In addition, the open spaces, car parks, sewers, water mains and service connections are taken in charge as outlined in red on the attached map, which was on public display during the prescribed period and the Director of Services report to the members for the April 2018 Carrick-on-Suir District Members Meeting”
