5. Consideration of the following notices of motion:-

(a) Councillor Andy Moloney

That this council carry out restructuring works on L31102, Chamberlainstown with immediate effect. This road is part of St Declans Way and now that funding has been secured it needs to be repaired as it is a public walking hazard.

(b) Councillor Andy Moloney

That this council move immediately to remove the silt islands from the river at Cahir Castle Bridge. Apart from the unsightliness of the 2 mounds it is a flood risk.

(c) Councillor Andy Moloney

That this council provide a roundabout at the junction of the Tipp road / Mitchelstown road junction outside SuperValu in Cahir due to the amount of accidents recorded recently.

(d) Councillor Catherine Carey

That colourful pavestones be installed outside the Town Hall, Clonmel, in recognition of the work carried out by the citizens of Clonmel who have done so much work over the years for Clonmel.

(e) Councillor Catherine Carey

That Saint Michaels Psychiatric unit in Clonmel be re-opened, I firmly believe that the closure of this unit in 2011 was wrong and prior to the closure of St. Michael's, the number of people waiting on trolleys in South Tipperary General Hospital never exceeded 1,000 people per annum. Since the closure of St. Michaels Unit, the number of people waiting on trolleys in STGH has increased year on year with 3,371 waiting on trolleys in 2016 compared to 2015 (figures from INMO.ie), as a result there is a direct correlation between the numbers of people waiting on trolleys in STGH since 2011.

We are putting people's lives at risk by continued negligence.

I hereby propose that Clonmel Borough District call on the Minister For Health to re-open St. Michael's with immediate effect to help solve the current crisis.

(f) Councillor Martin Lonergan & Councillor Richie Molloy

That in light of a recent serious incident on a premises at Lower Irishtown, Clonmel and ongoing anti-social behaviour at the site, that the Borough District would in the first instance take steps to

curb the anti-social behaviour and then to proceed to secure the area to prevent further incidents occurring.

(g) Councillor Siobhán Ambrose

In the interest of safety that Clonmel Borough Municipal District Council investigates the possibility of engaging with the relevant land owners with a view to removing some of the dangerous bends on the Glenconnor Road under it's 2017 Roads Programme.

(h) Councillor Siobhán Ambrose

That under the Council's 2017 Roads Works Programme that consideration is given to removing the existing old style pedestrian lights in Lisronagh and replacing them with the new flashing pedestrian lights similar to those at the Showgrounds Shopping Centre.

(i) Councillor Siobhán Ambrose

That in 2017 that Clonmel Borough District Council makes contact again with the relevant Agencies and Departments with a view to sourcing funding for the provision of Public Lighting on the Cycle/ Walk track on the Frank Drohan By-pass (ref my previous notice of motions on this issue).

(j) Councillor Richie Molloy

That Clonmel Borough District re-line the road on the Western Road / Queen Street Junction to indicate that there is a right hand turn into O' Neill Street.

(k) Councillor Pat English

That Clonmel Borough District take on board when developing the remaining phases of Suir Island the "Blackwood Report" on Suir Island. This report was commissioned and passed by the members of the former Clonmel Borough Council as a conservation action plan for the Island, also that community groups and interested individuals would be consulted on the future development of Suir Island.

(l) Councillor Pat English

That Clonmel Borough District provide new signage at the approach roads to Clonmel to acknowledge outstanding achievements of Clonmel in the national Tidy Towns competition, having received the gold medal award for the ninth successive year this year.

(m) Councillor Pat English

Following on from the attendance of the Housing Directive at our October Meeting, and the confirmation that only 29 social houses will be built by this Borough District in the coming years, I request that Clonmel Borough District seek a meeting with Minister Simon Coveney to seek additional urgent funding to fast track a social housing construction programme for the District.
